Lenten Midweek
Series (2/21-3/19):
Journeying with God
through our wilderness



FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR BEN

Dear family of God at Central,

"Miriam Sang to them, 'Sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea.' Then Moses ordered Israel to set out from the Red Sea, and they went into the wilderness of Shur. They went three days in the wilderness and found no water." Exodus 15:21-22

The people of Israel on their way out ("exodus") from Egypt, began with celebration. Miriam and all the women of Israel celebrated with tambourines and dancing, as they rightly should – they had been finally freed from 400 years of enslavement in Egypt. A new life they might not have dared envision nor even speak, saving from their cries to God (Exod. 2:23). Almost immediately after that celebration, though, on their way out, they enter into wilderness.

Wilderness in the Bible was not just a physical location of lands that were undeveloped, but instead was a concept. Wilderness was viewed as land that was not just uninhabited, but uninhabitable. It was land that they were sure could not support human life. It was a place where they could only survive for short periods of time, they would not be able to remain in one place – they would have to always be on the move searching for basic necessities as we see above, where after three days they still had not found water. It was a place of groundlessness and strife, always on a journey looking to where they were going next rather than where they were right now.

This Lent, we invite you into a journey. Our midweek Lenten series is entitled, "Journeying with God in our wilderness." As we all are on our own journey struggling to find grounding and meaning, we will be reminding ourselves that in the midst of wilderness God is with us, hears our cries, and responds to us. We will be spending time in the Exodus narrative seeing what God has revealed about who God is and who we are that speak to us in 2024 in our own wildernesses which are complicated and burdensome.

This Lent, on our Tuesday evening program we will be trying something new. We will have our soup supper at 5:15-6pm as we usually do. At 6, Music Together and Children's Choir will have classes as normal. The adult hour, though is going to be different. We will not have an "adult class" during Lent. Rather, at 6pm, we will have a Lenten Reflection on the Word of God from 6pm-6:45 which will have a ritual opening and be an interactive reflection on the Word. This will serve as our homily space for the evening – but it will be interactive and dynamic, not a sermon. Then, at 6:45, we will have Holden Evening Prayer with no homily (given that we already did that in the Reflection on the Word). It is possible, of course, to attend only one of these events, but I highly encourage you to try coming at least once to the entire experience from a simple soup supper (reminding ourselves of the simplicity of food in the wilderness) at 5:15, to the Lenten Reflection on the Word of God at 6, and then to Holden Evening Prayer at 6:45. The evening is set to take us all on a journey as we contemplate how God is with us in our own journeys in life.

We will begin at 6pm with mutual reflection on the Word of God, focusing upon our own experience of wilderness using Exodus 15-20 as our guide. This engagement with the Word will include the historical context of the wilderness wanderings, application to our lives, and most of all, small group conversation. Following this scriptural journey, we will conclude our evenings with Holden Evening Prayer at 6:45pm.
