News from Central's Book Club

The CLC Book Club will meet on Monday, Dec. 14, 2020, at 7:00pm via Zoom to discuss *The Water Dancer* by Ta-Nehisi Coates. This is a story of Hiram Walker, born into slavery and the son of the white owner of a Virginia plantation and one of his slaves. Although gifted with a mysterious power and

born with the gift of photographic memory, the one thing he cannot remember is his mother who was "sold south" when he was 9 years old. A brush with death brings "an urgency in Hiram and a daring scheme: to escape from the only home he's ever known." (goodreads.com)

The story blends the brutality of history with more imaginative elements. Beginning on the plantation, it moves North to Philadelphia where Hiram's enlisted in the underground war between slavers and the enslaved. Eventually, with Hiram's resolve to rescue the family he left behind, the story turns back to his southern birth place. The discussion will be led by Terie Gillis. **The ZOOM link will be sent out closer to the meeting date.**
